Statement on the Iraq crisis

Spring Plenary Meeting

Brussels, 27-28 March 2003

1. At this moment of war, we the Bishops of the Commission of the Bishops' Conferences of the European Community, pray for peace and justice in Iraq and in the world. We recall and support the important statements made by the Holy Father and our own Bishops' Conferences, and express our concern above all for the people who are suffering as the result of longstanding injustice and now war. This is not a conflict between religions, and the name of God should never be invoked to justify the resort to war or the use of violence. We appeal to Christians, Jews and Muslims to work together in solidarity in order to bring an end to the current strife in the region and to promote harmonious relations in our own countries.
2. We welcome the commitment of the European Union to provide humanitarian aid to the Iraqi people. This commitment to the victims of war represents an important step towards a just order in the region. For the same reason, we also strongly urge the European Union, with its partners in the international community, to redouble their efforts to help find a lasting solution to the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians. It is in these ways that the European Union can, through common action, make a significant contribution to peace and justice at this time.

3. This situation reinforces our conviction that the world needs a system of global governance capable of promoting and sustaining peace and the common good, in which the United Nations must play the central role. We hope that the work of the European Convention will lead a more united Europe to assume its responsibilities in such a system. For this, we believe that good relations based on mutual respect between the European Union and the United States of America are essential.
