Welcome to the Summer School Ghent 2026, a global, immersive program that has already brought together young leaders from 41 different countries, and now celebrates its third edition in one of Europe's most inspiring cities.

This year, you will learn and live in a historic monastery in Ghent (Belgium), transformed into a modern academic space where international students, expert faculty, and world-renowned speakers come together. **Imagine attending seminars led by politicians, worldwide leaders, scholars, and global policy experts**, all in a setting built for reflection, dialogue, and discovery. **The experience includes a visit to the European Parliament and discussions with Members.**

This edition will take place from 29 June to 3 July 2026, spanning five days, and is directed at young professionals from across Europe. It is a formative journey designed to support participants in understanding the major transformations shaping Europe, combining rigorous study, dialogue, community life, and informal exchanges with experts and participants. Over five days, participants will advance in reading and interpreting Europe's present, while reflecting on their own vocation, the meaning of political action, and the responsibility of engaged citizens in society.

The program includes high-level lectures, sessions with international experts, academics, and public officials, and community spaces that favor practical learning, through which participants address key aspects such as identity, geopolitics, democracy, demography, and the future of Europe, within a humanist and values-driven framework.



A program designed for young professionals engaged with Europe's future

The European Summer School targets **young professionals** who are committed to engaging with the political, social, and economic challenges facing Europe. Special consideration will be given to candidates who demonstrate **motivation, a solid academic or professional background, and a willingness to engage seriously with Europe's current challenges.**

Participants must be available to attend the full program in Belgium.

The program welcomes:

- **Early-career professionals** working in public affairs, policy, law, economics, civil society, or any field connected to European governance.
- **Academics and researchers** interested in interdisciplinary reflection on European identity and renewal.
- **Engaged citizens** who seek to move from observing crisis to shaping a shared future.

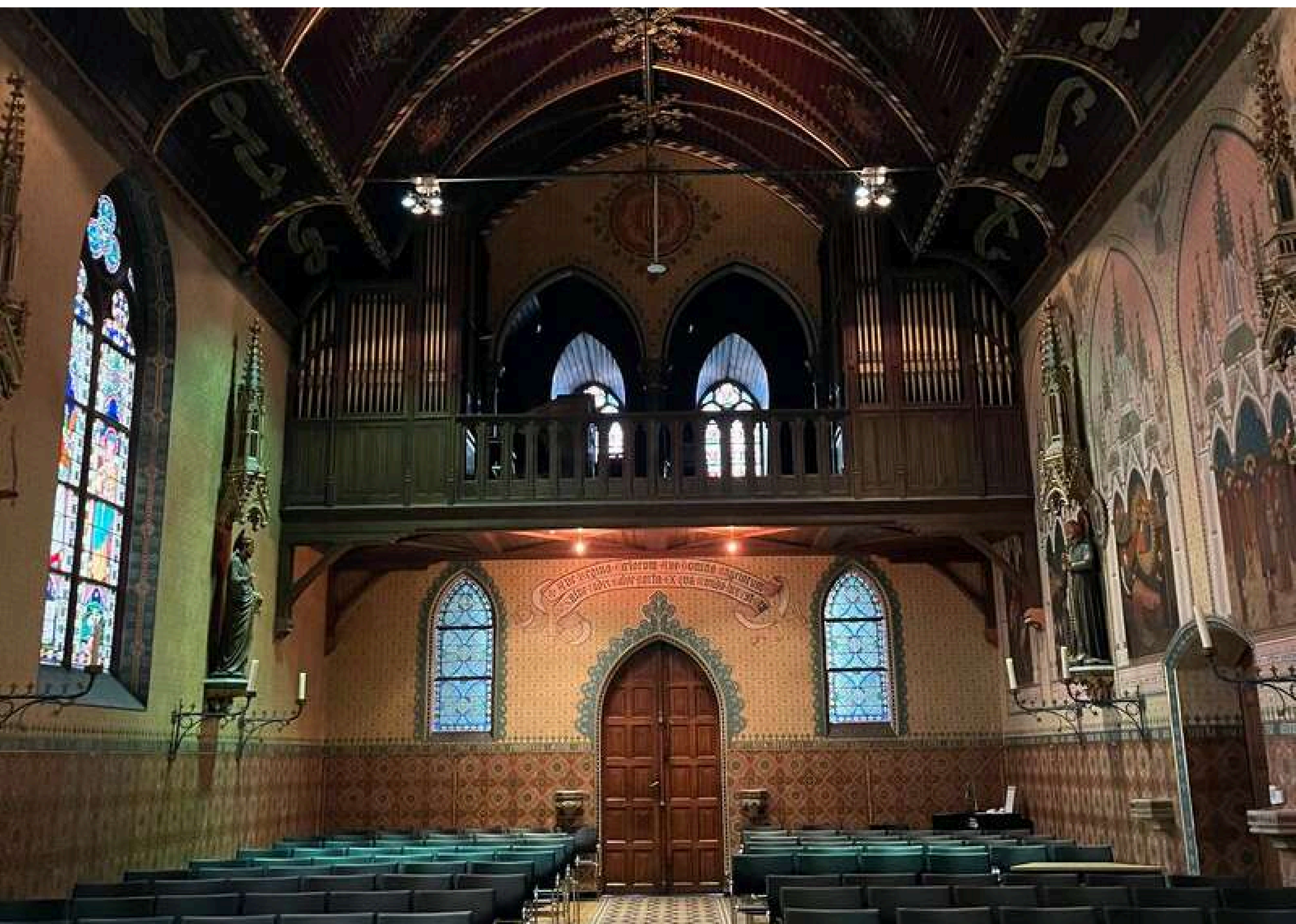

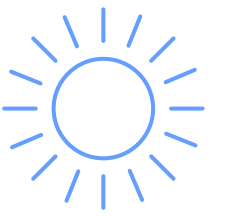

Location & Accommodation

Oude Abdij Drongen

Our 3rd edition will take place in Oude Abdij Drongen, a historic monastery surrounded by peaceful gardens along the River Leie. An ideal setting for reflection, rest, and renewed focus. Located in Drongen, just outside Ghent, the abbey is easy to reach from Brussels by direct train. From Bruxelles-Central to Drongen (Tronchiennes), the journey takes about 35–45 minutes!

How to Get There from Brussels

Take a direct SNCB train from Bruxelles-Central or Brussel-Midi/Zuid to Drongen.

- Average travel time: 36–45 minutes.
- Trains run frequently throughout the day.
- Upon arrival, the abbey is a short walk from the station.

Accommodation

5 days and 4 nights of full board in comfortable double rooms, overlooking the gardens or inner courtyard. Full board covers breakfast, lunch, dinner, and coffee breaks.
